Prospective ministers are expected to demonstrate right reasoning, precise knowledge of organic law, and impeccable standard of conduct necessary to run the affairs of the United Nuwabian Nation of Moors.

EXAMINATION DIRECTIONS & GRADING POLICY

1. This exam consists of exactly **199 standard competency questions** divided into three distinct parts.
2. **Part 1** covers the Constitutional Statutes, legal writs, and tribal genealogy (Questions 1 - 66).
3. **Part 2** covers Cultural Ethics, Family Responsibilities, Hygiene, and Social Conduct (Questions 67 - 132).
4. **Part 3** covers Cosmology, Nine Ether Chemistry, Scriptural Interpretations, and Nibiru (Questions 133 - 199).
5. Candidates must achieve a minimum score of **90% (179 correct answers)** to be eligible for ministerial placement.
